### Brian Havilah ACS



**Q. How long have you been a Toastmaster?**

I first joined Arncliffe RSL Toastmasters nearly 50 years ago. The Club folded after a few years and I went on to other interests.

**Some of my recollections of that time.**

Toastmasters was a much smaller organisation, with fewer clubs and no regions as we have today, just States.

It was men only, women had a separate Toastmistress organisation.

I do not remember the paths to improvement we have from our manuals these days, and I feel sure that the standards of speaking have improved enormously.

We rarely if ever came out from behind the lectern to speak and I don't recall any emphasis at all on gestures or body language.

Our competitions were Club / State / Australian Championship. An audiotape of the winners' speeches went to the International Convention, which I remember was held in Calvary, Canada in my time. The winning tape then won the 'Overseas Speech Contest

After a break of only about 40 years I was invited to a meeting of Cronulla RSL Toastmasters which rekindled my interest and I joined that Club.

Two years ago I transferred to Miranda Toastmasters, having been made very welcome here as a target speaker for one of our competitions.

**Q. Why did you join Toastmasters?**

I remember being young, nervous, lacking in confidence and looking for some way to gain some self esteem. I think my early time in Toastmasters helped me enormously as I went on to other interests.

I rejoined Toastmasters all those years later as a retiree, looking for an interest which might keep my mind active and would offer some sort of challenge.

**Q. What do you hope to achieve through Toastmasters?**

I hope to continue to keep my brain active. I want to continue to see new speakers develop and improve as we support them in this Club
